NBBCC Noosa Bush Beach & Creek Care, Sunshine Beach	<u>Cooloosa Urban Wetland Rehabilitation Stage 2 & Re-establishing Wildlife</u> <u>Linkage</u> Funded by Qld Govt this project aims to rehabilitat 2 severely degraded areas providing connectivity with adjoining lowland Rainforest by planting 6000 trees and propagating 1500 plants, weeding, installation of 3 cane toad traps, 45 volunteer working bees. NBBCC	<u>Morning Glory – Going Going – But More To Do</u> Re-establish multi-strata healthy deep rooted vegetation on the Heathland Drive riparian embankment of Cooloosa Wetland, to maintain its stability and integrity and reduce road pollutants and phosphorous entering the wetland and to provide habitat and food sources for wildlife. NBBCC	<u>Strengthen Existing and Establish Eucalyptus Conglomerata</u> Eucalyptus conglomerata or Swamp Stringybark is Qld's most endangered eucalypt, the aim is to increase numbers by 25% by experimenting with the most successful method of propagation of the seeds to grow the plants and raise community awareness. NBBCC	Wallum, Woodland and Wildlife Linkage to Wetland Margins The project is to rehabilitate Wallum Woodland, Dry Rainforest and Wetland margin by; rubbish removal, weeding and revegetation with multi strata, site specific plants. This will increase the biodiversity of the site, with its critically interdependent vegetation types and ecosystems, creating wildlife linkage of Noosa National Park, Girraween Section, Sunshine Creek and Sunshine Beach Foreshore Reserve. Eastern Beaches Collaborative	<u>Coastal Connect 2</u> This collaborative community project aims to restore ecological linkages and connectivity by rehabilitating coastal peat creek mouths, dunes and ephemeral wetlands along Noosa's eastern beach to ensure species resilience in the face of climate change. The collaborative include six bushcare groups; Peregian South, Peregian North, Peregian Creek, Castaways, Marcus Beach & Sunshine Beach (NBBCC) The Work done over 3 years finishes 30 th March 2023.
